Issue Response: Crane Collapse at Wolli Creek

An incident occurred at Wolli Creek in Sydney on Sunday morning during the erection of a tower crane for the construction of an apartment building.

We are deeply concerned this has occurred and our priority is the safety of the workers involved, surrounding residents and the general public. Three workers in the crane erection crew were injured. Two of the men were released from hospital last night and the third was released from hospital today.

Our on-site construction team responded to the situation immediately, making sure the injured workers were attended to as soon as possible. The team worked with the relevant authorities and emergency services to ensure public safety and to secure the site as quickly as possible.

The site is now secure and the crane is stabilised. We are continuing to work with emergency services, authorities, our engineers and engineers from Public Works and SafeWork to safely remove the crane as soon as possible.

While our first priority is to safely remove the crane, we are also undertaking our own inquiries into the incident.
