

Probuild awarded the demolition and enabling of Queen's Wharf, Brisbane

Destination Brisbane Consortium has awarded national tier-one construction company Probuild the demolition and enabling works of Queen's Wharf Brisbane under the Queen's Wharf Brisbane Priority Development Area Development Scheme.

The project involves the removal of three non-heritage Government buildings at 80 George Street, 100 George Street, and the Neville Bonner building at 75 William Street, which have already been vacated due to government staff relocation.

Probuild will commence works on 1 January 2017 under Demolition & Enabling Approval that will allow various services, relocation works, hoarding of the site, and soft strip-out of the non-heritage buildings earmarked for demolition, followed by the removal to ground level.

Probuild Queensland Managing Director Peter Ward said he was proud of his team, which had worked long hours and met every deadline to develop the winning tender.

"We're excited to start works in January and anticipate the demolition and enabling works will take most of 2017 to complete," said Mr Ward.

"Safety will be our highest priority and extra measures will be taken to assure the safety of motorists, pedestrians and cyclists within the proximity of Queen's Wharf. All heritage buildings within the site will remain protected and secured," Mr Ward said.

The project will have a flow on effect for the Queensland economy. Probuild will be supporting local jobs, as 150 workers are required to complete works.

As one of Australia's largest and most successful construction companies, this important project adds to Probuild's growing profile of major projects in Queensland.
